Spring is almost around the corner and we can't wait! One sign of spring is that the 2019 MCAS standardized testing sessions are upon us. Through our daily curriculum and instruction, we are always preparing our students to reach the standards. The MCAS test is a way to measure student growth, curriculum and instruction effectiveness. There are a few things parents and families can do to help children prepare for tests (whether teacher-made or standardized). You can help create a positive and supportive environment for your children. I have included a few tips from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education:

- If your child is nervous at test time, ask his/her teacher for tips on helping him/her relax.
- Make sure that your child is in school during the testing sessions. Do not plan any doctor or dental appointments on test dates.
- Encourage your child to listen carefully to all test-taking directions given by the teacher and to ask questions about any directions that are unclear.
- See that your child gets his/her regular amount of sleep before the tests and is well-rested.
- Make sure that your child eats his/her usual breakfast on the day of the test. Hunger can detract from a good test performance.
- Encourage your child to do his/her best.

Grade 4 – April 25 and 26

Grade 3 – April 30 and May 2

Grade 4 – May 7 and 8

More information will follow soon. Please try not to schedule appointments during this time as failure to take any portion of the MCAS exam is included in the student's permanent folder.



From the Math Department

Fractions are everywhere!

We work with fractions everyday even though we may not realize it. For example, fractions are used every time we look at a clock. We know that quarter past (1/4), half past (1/2), and quarter till the hour are fractions. We relate it to the whole hour.

Whenever we tell time, cook, shop, travel, split things up, or share, we think about fractions. Fractions are required anytime someone needs to work with parts of something. How could we bake a cake without using fractions. If it were not for fractions, baking a cake would be impossible. Three eggs for the recipe is 1/4 of a dozen. In fact, every ingredient in a cake recipe is a fraction of something: three fourths cup of milk, a half tablespoon of salt, a half cup of shortening, and two and a half cups of flour. Can you imagine the result of baking a cake mixing an entire salt shaker, a gallon of milk, a dozen eggs and an entire bag of flour? We would have a really bad tasting cake!

We encourage parents and families to "Talk Fractions" at home.

Can you think of another example of working with fractions outside of school?

Try it at home

- We have 5 people in my family, my mom is one-fifth of the family. What fraction represents my 2 brothers in the family?
- I bought 1 dozen donuts. How many donuts is one half of the dozen? What is the fraction that represents 1 donut out of the 12?
- The football game is 4 quarters long. Each quarter is 15 minutes. How long does it take to play 2 quarters? How long is 3 quarters? How long is 4 quarters?
- The brownies were cut up into 8 pieces. My sister ate 2 pieces. What is the fraction that represents what my sister ate?
- I went apple picking at Honey Pot Hill. My family picked 15 apples and put them in the bag. When we got home, I put one third of the apples in the fruit bowl. What is one third of 15?

If you weren't able to make the first Parents in P.E. week, we'll be hosting another session during the week of **March 18**th-**22**nd.


